

CONTEXT together we achieve

The 2021-2023 Morley Senior High School Business Plan builds on the work of our school community and the success of our previous business plan. High Quality Teaching, Relationships, and Positive Learning Environment will continue to be our focus areas.

Education at Morley SHS is a partnership between staff, students, parents and the wider community. We recognise and celebrate our cultural and ethnic diversity and promote understanding through our academic and non-academic endeavours. We value and promote personal and social responsibility, as well as student leadership through leadership programs, such as fundraising for our Cambodian sister school (the Angkor project), the Morley Leos (affiliated with the Ballajura and Noranda Lions Clubs) and Student Council.

Students in Years 7 to 10 have access to engaging programs, including two Department of Education approved specialist programs, Aviation Academy and School of Screen and Media (Multimedia and Broadcasting). All students in Years 7 to 9 study a language and have the opportunity to participate in activities associated with exchange partnerships with our sister schools in Japan and China. The Performance Plus program for Year 7 to 9, which incorporates student-led learning opportunities, encourages students to become critical thinkers. In this program, students develop problem-solving skills to address real-life issues in a cross-curricular setting.

To ensure that all students are prepared for successful transition beyond school, all Year 11 and 12 students are presented with a wide range of opportunities to pursue career and study pathways. We offer a broad range of curriculum options, including General courses, VET certificates and ATAR courses, that are supported by local universities. In addition, Morley SHS is a Registered Training Organisation (RTO) and operates a state-of-the-art Automotive Trade Training Centre.

International students enrolled at Morley SHS are a vital component of the multi -cultural makeup of our school. Students who require assistance with literacy skills may access our dedicated Intensive English Centre, which is staffed by specially trained English as an Additional Language/Dialect (EALD) teachers.



SELF REVIEW & IMPROVEMENT PROCESS

The Morley Senior High School Business Plan 2021-2023 was created in collaboration with the School Board, staff, students and parents. It contains specific targets related to improvement of student achievement and attendance, along with the priorities and strategies to achieve them.

The Business Plan incorporates the principles and priorities outlined in the Department of Education strategic documents, including: Strategic Directions for Public Schools 2020-2023 – Every student, every classroom, every day; annual Focus documents; the Aboriginal Cultural Standards Framework, and the School Improvement and Accountability Framework.

Morley Senior High School has developed a rigorous process for self-assessment that incorporates regular analysis of available school and system-wide data. We also use the National School Improvement Partnership suite of surveys, using the data from these surveys to inform our reflection and the development of our forward planning.


OUR STUDENT IMPROVEMENT TARGETS

Morley Senior High School aims to achieve the following student improvement targets by 2023:

- The percentage of students who attend regularly (90% or more of the time) is increased in all year groups.
- The rate of progress from Year 7 to 9 in NAPLAN Reading, Writing and Numeracy is higher than Australian Schools.
- The percentage of students achieving Band 8 and above in Year 9 NAPLAN Writing, Reading and Numeracy is increased.
- WACF achievement to be above the State mean.
- The rate of progress from Year 10 to 12 in OLNA Reading, Writing and Numeracy is higher than Like Schools.
- The differential between Perceived and Actual results, as reported by students in the National School Improvement Partnership survey 'Reporting and Seeking Help' domain, is decreased.

- Strengthen existing community connections (with local school networks, universities, community-based agencies, local employers and international partnerships) and seek new partnership opportunities.


POSITIVE LEARNING ENVIRONMENT
